"FROM CONSTANTINOPLE TO THE DE CHARNYS"  
A presentation by genealogist Noel Currer-Briggs

Educated at Bryanston School and St Catherine's College, Cambridge, Noel Currer-Briggs was a cryptanalyst at GCHQ, Bletchley Park during World War II. In 1956 he became a professional genealogist, and is the author of eight books on the subject. During the last few years he has become deeply interested in the Templar associations of the Shroud, and in the genealogy of the De Charny family. This lecture will be his first public presentation of his findings - and it promises to be a must for BSTS members and all interested in the Shroud's historical origins.
