

Prof. GIOVANNI TAMBURELLI, of the University of Turin and CSELT-IRI (Centro Studi e Laboratori Telecomunicazioni) has done extensive work in 3-dimensional elaborations of the Holy Face. In Nov. 1981, his purely scientific article appeared in PAMI (see SPECTRUM #1 and Correction below). Having presented a complete album of his scientific research to Pope John Paul II, he received a letter of thanks and congratulations. His Holiness observed that "the work accomplished on the basis of advanced scientific technic allows us to discern with greater precision the mysterious Man wrapped in the Holy Linen." In May of 1979, Prof. Tamburelli was named "Turinese of the Year" for his important contributions to the study of the Shroud image.

Dr. PETER DEMBOWSKI graduated from the University of British Columbia and took a doctorate in Slavic philology in Paris, then a Ph.D. in Romance philology and Old French literature at the University of California. After teaching at the University of Toronto, Dr. Dembowski is now Chairman of the Department of Romance Languages and Literature at the University of Chicago, where he has been teaching since 1966. Of particular interest to sindonologists is his book: *La Chronique de Robert De Clari; étude de la longue et du style*, published in 1963 by the University of Toronto Press.

Mons. PIETRO CAMELLO is chaplain of the Holy Shroud Chapel in the cathedral of St. John Baptist, Turin. As Custodian of the Shroud, he holds two of the three keys to the reliquary. From his firsthand knowledge of the Cloth and his deep study of it, stem his consummate writings and the transcendent reflections of his homilies.
