In the year of the exposition of the Holy Shroud which will take place on 10<sup>th</sup> April to 23<sup>rd</sup> May. During this exposition, Pope Benedict XVI will visit Turin on 2<sup>nd</sup> of May and will preside at a Holy Mass in the atrium of the city's Cathedral. This will be the first time that the Shroud will be exposed after it's restoration since 2002. To be able to understand better this venerable cloth we divided this course in four units.

Each of them, will help us to understand in a clear and objective way from a particular perspective: what the Holy Shroud is and as well as the first investigations done. Furthermore, we also count on the invaluable consultation of Dr. John Jackson and his wife Rebecca, Dr. Emanuela Marinelli; and as well as Dr. David Oddo Benavides.
